Case Study: Addressing Common Errors in Sanskrit Examination

Failure Mode 3: Gender Mismatch in Visheshana-Visheshya

In Sanskrit, the adjective (Visheshana) must match the noun (Visheshya) in gender, number, and case. This is a frequent area of marks deduction. *Solution:* Constant drill of **Shabdarupa** tables (Deva, Kavi, Bhanu, etc.).

Instructional Design for Educators

For teachers and lecturers, the delivery of the 1st PUC Sanskrit syllabus should follow an **Integrated Linguistic Approach**. Rather than teaching grammar as a separate unit, it should be extracted from the chapters. For instance, while teaching the lesson '*Dve Vidye Veditavye*', the teacher should highlight the **Lut Lakara**forms found in the Upanishadic text to provide real-world context to grammatical rules.
